Solve problems involving multiplication and division using manipulatives, arrays, and repeated addition

Fractions - recognise, find, name and write fractions  $\frac{1}{3}$ ,  $\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\frac{2}{4}$  and  $\frac{3}{4}$  of a length, shape, set of objects or quantity

Time—tell the time to nearest five minutes, including: a quarter past and quarter to AND draw the hands on the clock

Compare and sequence intervals of time

£ and p - solve problems including giving change

Choose and use appropriate standard units to estimate and measure  $^{\circ}\text{C}$

Recognise the inverse relationship between  $+$  and  $-$  and use this to check calculations and solve missing number problems
