Governors looked at initial SATs data for KS1 which shows a steady improvement in achievement in areas like phonics. Other SATs data will be with the school in the next few weeks and the Governing Body will study it thoroughly in September.

The Teaching, Learning and Achievement committee reported that external LA moderation has confirmed the excellent quality of Stroud Valley KS1 pupil assessment. This is important for parents as you can be very confident that judgements about your child's attainment and progress are accurate.
