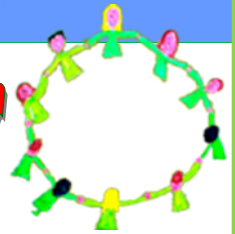

After our session on the water cycle, we all got to explore the rest of 'We The Curious' which the children really enjoyed.



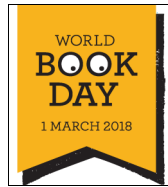
